Unique in the Fulbright world, this program seeks to strengthen ties between the private sectors in both countries.

Recent graduates and young professionals from both the U.S. and Mexico with demonstrated academic and professional excellence, complete professional internships and take MBA courses over 10 months. This combination of professional and academic insight affords grantees the opportunity to learn how business is conducted in their host country.

Each grantee is a potential future leader in the commercial, entrepreneurial, political or non-profit spheres. Indeed, over the course of three decades, nearly 300 U.S. grantees have participated in the program, two of which have appeared in Forbes' "30 under 30" list while others have interned and worked in the White House or started their own companies. U.S. participants commonly work in Mexico City and take classes at the Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México, one of Mexico's most prestigious private universities known for its strengths in administration and economics.

- **Experience:** Ideally less than 3 years of work experience post-graduation.

4 to 6 MBA level courses in one academic year.
